



# Message From the Board Chair & CEO

As we celebrate our 20th anniversary in 2022, Habitat for Humanity Peterborough & Kawartha Region is at an extraordinary stage - significantly increasing the number of families it partners with to build strength, stability, and self-reliance through affordable homeownership with the completion of its first multi-unit residential development at Leahy's Lane in Peterborough.

A lot has changed since the beginnings of Habitat PKR, we've grown from an all-volunteer organization building one house a year to an organization transforming the futures of 82 families since 2002 (41 of those families in 2022 alone)!

We've opened three ReStores to help build more homes for people in need of decent and affordable housing and giving new life to gentlyused household items ranging from kitchen cupboards to windows and stoves, to smaller home decor items.

In 2021, we welcomed experienced leader Susan Zambonin as CEO, after the departure of Sarah Budd after 15 years with Habitat PKR. Susan is committed to upholding the great work that continues to transpire on behalf of local families and continuing to innovate and find more ways to help local families Build Better Futures.

Like so many others, the COVID-19 pandemic presented many obstacles and uncertainties - lockdowns, ReStore closures, limited volunteers on site, soaring costs of building materials, supply chain issues, labour shortages, and a skyrocketing housing market.

But one thing remains true - the philosophy of a community coming together to help families build strength, stability, and self-reliance through affordable homeownership.

The hard work and generosity of our steadfast supporters makes it possible for our homeowners to have access to something many of us take for granted - peace of mind and a safe, decent, and affordable place to call home. Through the commitment of our Habitat PKR homeowners, community partners, Board of Directors, volunteers, donors, and staff, Habitat PKR continues to make a much-needed impact on affordable homeownership in the Peterborough and Kawartha Region.

Our work would NOT be possible without your unwavering support. Unique as we all are, we are bonded by a vision of building a world where everyone has a decent place to live.

We must remain diligent in our efforts to create more opportunity for affordable homeownership. Affordable homeownership has never been farther out of reach - and never has Habitat PKR's work been as important.

There are exciting things ahead as we break ground on several new projects and find new ways to innovate so that we can serve more families and create more impact beyond the walls of the homes we build.

# **Affordable Homeownership**

We know that safe, decent, and affordable homeownership plays a critical role in helping families build a foundation for a life with better choices and more opportunities. With a little help, Habitat homeowners are able to achieve the strength, stability, and independence they need to build better lives for themselves and their families. They are empowered to overcome the barriers that stand between their families and better, healthier, more financially stable lives. The outcomes are long-lasting and life-changing.

Habitat PKR partners with individuals, couples, seniors, and families in the Peterborough & Kawartha Region to help them buy their own homes through a unique affordable homeownership solution.

With your support, 82 families in the Peterborough & Kawartha Region have achieved strength, stability, and independence through affordable homeownership. These families included, 119 children, 27 single-parent led households, and 3 Indigenous families.

With the help of volunteers, donors, partners, and Habitat homeowners, we build and rehabilitate decent and affordable homes, from single-family houses to multi-unit developments. We don't give away free homes – the families and individuals who partner with us pay an affordable mortgage geared to their income and volunteer at least 500 'sweat-equity' hours with us.

# How a Small Affiliate Went Big

### a 41-unit innovative condo development

In 2019, after asking ourselves "how can we serve more families?" Habitat PKR decided to embark on a new innovative building model that added multi-residential developer to Habitat PKR's traditional home builder role.

After years of planning, and with support from the Canada Mortgage & Housing Corporation (CMHC), Vancity

Community Investment Bank (VCIB), Habitat Canada's agreement with the National Housing Co-Investment Fund, and the many generous partners, donors, trades, and volunteers helping in the ReStore, Habitat PKR successfully completed a 41-unit affordable condo development in the City of Peterborough in April of 2022.

The condo building is three stories with a mix of one, two, and three-bedroom condos and offers a fully universal design to accommodate current or future homeowners' accessibility needs. The building is also constructed using energy-efficient materials leading to reduced costs for heating and cooling, furthering the affordability for homeowners.

Before the condo project, Habitat for Humanity Peterborough & Kawartha Region had served 41 families. With the completion of the 41-unit condo development, Habitat PKR was able to double it's impact, helping 41 more families achieve their dreams of affordable homeownership.

# A New Mortgage Model

To serve more families, Habitat PKR adopted a new mortgage model that would help more families have access to affordable homeownership while generating sustainable funds to invest in the building of more affordable homes.

While the Classic Model is still available to families that partner with Habitat PKR, the new Financial Partner Model has proven to be successful at providing affordable mortgages for homeowners allowing them to build equity, while covering the cost of construction so Habitat PKR can continue building more affordable homes for local families.

#### The Classic Model

- No down payment
- · No interest mortgage held by Habitat PKR
- Construction financed by donations & previous homeowner payments

#### **NEW - Financial Partner Model**

- No down payment
- Financial Partner first mortgage (low-interest)
- Habitat PKR second mortgage (no payment until sold or refinanced)
- Equity stake payable on sales & refinancing

Through the building of multi-unit residential buildings and a new mortgage model,
Habitat PKR is able to help more types of families have access to affordable
homeownership including smaller families, seniors, individuals, and couples. Families in
need, that would not qualify for a traditional Habitat detached home.

### **Lindsay - 6 families served**

Between the years 2015 and 2019 Habitat PKR built 5 homes in the community of Lindsay, which have served 6 local families.

Families like Tara, Sean, and their two children who despite working hard and having a steady income, could not reach their goal of having a safe place to call home without Habitat PKR.

"We prayed and dreamed for years about owning our own home – a place that is ours," said Tara. "It didn't seem like it would ever happen!"

In 2020 single-mother Jennifer and her 4 children moved into their new home in Lindsay. Their home was a previous Habitat PKR build from 2015 that welcomed its second homeowner family.

### **Bobcaygeon - 2 families served**

In 2021, Habitat PKR completed 2 builds in the community of Bobcaygeon helping two local families who had been searching for a safe and stable place to call home.

One of those families included single-mother Buffy, and her two children, one of whom lives with a developmental disability.

"I have always wanted stability for my children. They have never had a backyard to play in. They have never been able to invite friends over. They have never had a birthday party at home," says Buffy.

With her Habitat home, Buffy and her family are enjoying having a place of their own where they can grow together.

### **Empowering through shelter**

### Peterborough - 68 families served

Over the course of 20 years, Habitat PKR has built 23 family homes, 41 condos, and provided a hand-up into affordable homeownership for 68 families in the City of Peterborough.

Families like Robin's, a single mother of two, dreaming of having a safe and stable place for her children to grow up.

"I had always thought I would prefer to own my own home rather than rent, but over the years things just never really lined up. Then, a few years ago I thought I might be ready to enter the market but then the housing prices seemed to skyrocket, so, between that and the hurdle of saving a down payment, I resigned myself to renting for the long term. Once I became a single mom though, I really wanted to put down roots and build equity and have a home to raise my girls in." said Robin.

Thanks to Habitat PKR, Robin and her children have a new home base from which to explore the world.

Or families like Sabrina's - a mother who battled and overcame cancer shortly before losing her partner and having to learn how to provide for her daughter as a single parent. After the chemo had taken a toll on her body, she wasn't able to continue her job due to the physical demands.

With the help of Habitat PKR, Sabrina and her daughter found a safe and stable home to start their new chapter together. The increased financial stability and security have also enabled her to retrain to become a health care administrator – a related profession that offers better opportunities and is not so physically demanding.

In 2022, Habitat PKR's 41-unit condo building helped serve individuals, couples, and seniors - demographics that previously, could not qualify for Habitat's traditional builds of single-family homes. With the support of the community, an individual like Jordan who uses a wheelchair, was able to have a fully-retrofitted unit to meet his accessibility needs and help him live independently and barrier-free.

# **Curve Lake First Nation - 2 families** served

Maawandoonan – Coming Together in Partnership celebrates the unified efforts of Curve Lake First Nation and Habitat for Humanity PKR to provide low-income Indigenous families with the help needed to own a safe, decent, and affordable home.

In partnership with Curve Lake First Nation, 2 single-detached Habitat PKR homes were built on the Traditional Territory in 2019, for two local Indigenous families. One for Ashkingeekwa, James, and their daughter, and one for Tanya, Duanne, and their 5 children.

Habitat PKR's Women Build Program and hundreds of other volunteers were instrumental in raising funds and participating in making these safe, decent, and affordable homes possible for these local families.

"To our family, a Habitat home means we can finally see our dreams coming true. We can say, this is our home and be proud of it!" says Tanya.



### Lakefield - 2 families served

In partnership with the Lakefield United Church, and with support from the Good Samaritans Hands-Up Foundation and many other volunteer teams, Habitat PKR built a single-family home for a local family in 2012.

Two years later and just in time for Christmas, another Habitat PKR home was completed in Lakefield which provided a hand-up for Jennifer, a single mother of three.

"We are super excited to be moving into our new home," said Jennifer. "We are going into a house we now call a home. It is the best Christmas present you could ever receive. The boys are so happy. We can't thank the community and all those who helped enough. They are so generous, friendly and genuine."

- 5 Habitat PKR homes are built with 4 in the City of Peterborough, and 1 in the community of Norwood.

### **Buckhorn - 1 family served**

In partnership with the Anglican Deanery of Peterborough District and Christ Lutheran Church Covenants, in 2006 Habitat PKR constructed its first Habitat build in the County of Peterborough. This was the 4th house for Habitat PKR and served a local family in the community of Buckhorn.

The generous fundraising from the local faith groups and the hard work from the volunteers and build teams were instrumental in helping build this home.



### Norwood - 1 family served

Habitat PKR was working for years trying to build a home in the community of Norwood, but it was the local businesses, local high school students, and residents of Norwood who really helped make it happen. The community embraced Habitat, volunteered their time, helped fundraise, and welcomed the new Habitat homeowners with open arms.

Just in time for Christmas, single mother Robyn and her 5 children received the best gift of all - a safe place to call home.



### Warsaw - 1 family served

In the summer of 2016, Habitat PKR broke ground on a single-family detached home in the community of Warsaw for a local family of four.

Parents Josh and Natasha met while using the services of the Youth Emergency Shelter when they were 17 years of age. 12 years of hard work and two kids later, they were in need of safe and stable housing for themselves and their daughters.

By purchasing their Habitat home, Josh and Natasha's family is happy to be investing in something that will benefit their family for years to come.

Volunteers are the heart of Habitat for Humanity. Without their passion, time, and dedication, our mission would not be possible.

For years, volunteers alongside Habitat homeowners have been swinging hammers, installing drywall, and helping customers find the items they are looking for in our Habitat ReStores. All to help more people have access to safe, decent, and affordable homes.

In 2020, it all changed. Like many others, Habitat PKR experienced challenges and economic shocks from the COVID-19 pandemic which led to delays in Habitat's programs, including volunteering. We had to re-evaluate how and where we could safely continue to work with our volunteers, while our build sites were closed and we figured out how to adapt to the new 'normal'.

While many people were stuck at home with extra time to organize and purge, we found an opportunity. With local donation bins and centers closed, and the local landfill filling up, we opened our Habitat ReStore doors to temporarily collect donations of clothing.

After receiving over 6,000 bags of new and used clothing donations in just 6 months, our volunteers (particularly youth), jumped on the opportunity to support the textile waste diversion program and helped sort, process, and merchandise all 6,000+ bags of new and gently used clothing.

Many of these donations helped support community partners like the New Canadians Centre, and the Youth Emergency Shelter (YES).

Two years later, as the world is recovering from the pandemic, the textile diversion program has ended and we are once again seeing familiar faces in the Habitat ReStores, and in the new Peterborough Tool Library. We're looking forward to having more volunteers join Habitat PKR in the future.

Since 2011, Women Build has rallied countless female volunteers to help families in the Peterborough & Kawartha Region achieve brighter futures through affordable homeownership.

Unfortunately, the Women Build program had to be delayed due to the global COVID-19 pandemic. We are eager to continue the Women Build program when it is safe to do so.









### **Corporate Build Program**

Habitat PKR Build Days provide a meaningful teambuilding opportunity to participate on a local Habitat build project alongside the construction crew. Teams get training and leadership through the build process and learn about what it takes to build a home.

When a company participates in a Habitat Build Day, they are challenged to roll up their sleeves and learn about themselves and each other. Most importantly, teams are able to create real change in their community, helping a local family have a decent and affordable place to call home.

Over the years, a number of local businesses and corporations have joined Habitat for Humanity Peterborough & Kawartha Region on a build site to give back to their community and help families achieve homeownership.

### **Engaging Youth**

With the generosity of our donors and partners, local youth who volunteer with Habitat PKR are able to gain valuable skills and confidence that will serve them in their future career aspirations - all through volunteerism.

**Habitat Youth Program (HYP) -** offering youth the opportunity to organize and participate in fundraising, advocating for housing in the community, and assisting on local build projects.

Habitat Youth Council - is tasked with engaging area schools in generating awareness of the local affordable housing crisis, advocating Habitat's core mission, and fundraising to build more homes.

Habitat ReStores are non-profit home improvement and building supply stores that accept and resell quality new and gently-used building materials, furniture, appliances, and home décor items.

Shopping at a Habitat ReStore is a socially conscious decision, as funds generated are used to fund local Habitat for Humanity homebuilding projects in your community. It's also an environmentally conscious decision, as much of what is sold, is new or gently-used items that would otherwise end up in a landfill.

# Peterborough South ReStore



In 2004, the first Habitat ReStore and social enterprise is opened locally by Habitat for Humanity Peterborough & Kawartha Region, to support the building of more safe, decent, and affordable homes locally.

It first opened at 780 Erskine Ave, in the City of Peterborough. 10 years later, it moved to its current home at 550 Braidwood Ave.

# **Lindsay ReStore**

In 2013, what was then known as Habitat for Humanity Peterborough and District, expanded its territory to include the City of Kawartha Lakes. Thus leading to the adoption of the new name, Habitat for Humanity Peterborough & Kawartha Region.

Shortly after, Habitat PKR opened its second Habitat ReStore, this time in Lindsay at 50 Mary St. W. In 2018, the Lindsay ReStore moved to its current location at 55 Angeline St. N.



# Peterborough North ReStore



In 2019, Habitat PKR opened it's third ReStore, the Peterborough North ReStore at 300 Milroy Drive.

The location is now also home to Habitat PKR's main office, and the recently acquired Peterborough Tool Library. The Tool Lending Library helps members of the community have access to hundreds of tools for a low annual membership fee. Funds raised help support Habitat PKR's efforts to build more affordable homes.
